Employment at Clover Patch

Each cabin typically has six direct care counselors working directly with eight campers. As a team, the cabin staff work together twenty-four hours a day to give their campers a full week of fun, laughter and new friends.

Every morning begins with the raising of the flag and morning welcome song. Daily activities include arts & crafts, sports & outdoor recreation, music & drama, nature activities, swimming, guest entertainment and much more. Interspersed through the activities are the daily necessities including meals, showers and medications. Each day ends with lights out at 9:00 p.m.

Each camping session begins and ends with a campfire ceremony to anticipate the excitement, celebrate each camper, bid farewell to new friends and cherish memories.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who comes to camp?

 Children (min. age 5) and adults with physical and intellectual disabilities

What are the ages of the campers?

✤ 5%, 5-9
25%, 10-19
15%, 20-29
20%, 30-39
35%, 41+ years

What types of disabilities do the campers have?

- A range including mild to severe intellectual disability, autism, cerebral palsy, muscular dystrophy, ADHD, traumatic brain injury, medically frail
- ♣ 35% non-ambulatory, 40% non-verbal

How many campers attend and what is the camper to staff ratio?

- ♣ Maximum of 24 campers per session
- ♣ 2:1 camper to staff ratio

How many staff work at camp?

 18 direct care staff, 4 support staff, 3 nurses, 3 administrators

Who works at camp?

- ♣ 75% are college-aged students
- ✤ 30% from Europe, 5% from Asia, 65% from USA
- ♣ 30% staff return rate

Do I have to swim?

 Counselors are expected to swim with campers daily

Where is Glenville?

♣ 35 minutes Northwest of Albany, NY

Where do I sleep?

- Counselors are required to sleep 1-2 nights weekly in the camper cabins
- All off-duty staff sleep separate from campers in shared living quarters in rustic cabins with screened windows and bunk beds

What type of food is served?

- Simple, balanced, family-style (e.g. hamburgers, spaghetti, tacos, etc.)
- Staff with special dietary needs are required to supply their own food
- A staff refrigerator is available for personal food items

What is the time-off schedule?

- Sessions begin at 11 A.M. on Sunday and end at 3 P.M. on Friday
- Each staff person has two hours off during the day (Monday-Thursday) and 1-2 nights off per week
- Friday night, all-day Saturday, and Sunday morning off!

How do I get around?

- Camp is located on a city bus line with daily service to stores, shops, libraries, entertainment, banks, etc.
- Camp is convenient to the bus/train station and Albany airport for extended trips
- ♣ Taxi service is available
- Uber and Lyft are now available!

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
